We have been active in the paper industry for more than 100 years - for over 75 years at our Miltenberg site. The world of hygiene has changed massively since then. With timeless quality and a constant stream of new ideas, we have always managed to keep our finger on the pulse. Every day we meet the growing demands and multiplied requirements and fulfill them with reliability. Hygienic paper today.

The roots of our company go back to 1911, when Hermann Friedrich founded a paper processing company in Berlin. Taken over by his sons Albert and Kurt as early as 1932, the new paper mill in Miltenberg was finally established in 1948 under the leadership of Albert Friedrich. With a tradition-conscious view of the past, Fripa works every day on strategic planning and its implementation for a good and secure future.



## 1911

Founding of a paper processing company by Hermann Friedrich in Berlin.

## 1948-50

Founding of Fripa – ‘Friedrich Papier’ – by Albert Friedrich and construction of the factory in Miltenberg.

## 1950

Start of paper production and processing at the Miltenberg site with a crepe paper machine and various processing machines.

## 1974

Development and production of special tissue for the incontinence sector. Commissioning of a paper machine for tissue materials in Miltenberg.

## 1987

New paper machine for crepe grades replaces the previous production capacities.

## 1998-2006

Commissioning of new rewinder lines for toilet papers, kitchen papers and paper towels.

## 2007

Handover of the management from Ursula Queck to her daughter Verena Queck-Glimm (granddaughter of Albert Friedrich).

## 2008

Certification according to DIN EN ISO 14001.  
Start-up of the new toilet paper production line VI.  
Commissioning of the PM6 paper machine.

## 2009

A combined heat and power plant begins supplying energy to the company.

## 2010

Certification of the Chain of Custody according to FSC® and PEFC. Expansion of the factory premises’ certification according to OHSAS 18001.

## 2011

Commissioning of the new, fully automatic high-bay warehouse. Start-up of the new toilet paper production line VII.

## 2012-13

Certification according to DIN EN ISO 50001:2011.  
Certification according to IFS (Household and Personal Care Products, ‘Higher Level’).

## 2015

Commissioning of the PM7 paper machine.

## 2018-20

Planning and construction of a further production hall for paper processing and an administration building.

## 2023

75th anniversary in Miltenberg. Development plan of Miltenberg site expansion.

## 2024

With the Fripa redesign, we are setting a modern example for the future - it strengthens our image, underlines our commitment to the Miltenberg location and shows us as an attractive and strong employer.

The Cartasetta paper mill has been a partner of Fripa since 1974. It produces high-quality, environmentally friendly tissue paper for the Swiss market. On this basis, the retail trade and the away-from-home market are served quickly and in line with demand.

Tela GmbH has been part of the Fripa group of companies since May 2021. The site in Niederbipp primarily produces tissue paper based on waste paper. The interaction between waste paper processing, sludge incineration, the paper machines and the wastewater treatment plant forms a closed cycle.

The Czerwonak paper mill close to Poznan has been producing tissue paper for over 80 years. The machine and storage technology has been consistently upgraded to the latest standards in recent years. Our partner manufactures products specifically for the Polish market directly on site.

## Healthcare


